YWCA St. Paul:

- Changes minds, bodies and lives through programs and services in Housing & Supportive Services, Youth Development, Health & Wellness and Skills for Life & Work.
- Benefits women, men and children (6,900+ during 2010).
- Has been meeting community needs since 1907.
- Is a 501(c)3 organization, that is governed by a Board of Directors and employs an average of 140 employees (approximately 42 percent are full-time).
- Is funded by: government awards (33 percent), United Way funding (11 percent), contributions from foundations, corporations and individuals (15 percent), memberships, program fees and operating income (41 percent).
- Has experienced steady growth and has annual expenses of approximately \$6.1 million (up from \$1 million in 1990).
- Has an endowment of more than \$572,000.
- Utilizes careful cost management and volunteers to ensure that 92 cents of every dollar goes directly to services for women, children and families.
